Fresh Strawberries Due—Grape Fruit Business Expanded Here.

STRAWBERRIES DUE AGAIN

If a carload of choice Louisiana strawberries reached Portland this morning, as planned, local merchants will have some nice offerings in that line tomorrow. None have been definitely advised that the shipment will arrive in time, but it was due, and merchants here believe they will have good berries tomorrow. Fresh tomatoes have also been promised.

Butter is down to 35 cents straight for creamery varieties and the less cost of living is evident in various other commodities. Eggs are selling at 20 cents, and butter at the same figure. New cabbage is one of the new market offerings, selling at 5 cents.

Excellent Grape Fruit Here.

Florida grape fruit of a variety hard to beat, and one that satisfied the fastidious grape fruit crank, has reached La Grande. A couple of years ago there were less than half a dozen grape fruit customers in local markets and today the grape fruit brigade has tripled and tripled itself until that commodity is one of the much sought after articles of trade, and converts are rapidly won over. A local member of the local Rialto today said that no commodity which he handles has had such an increased demand in a short period of three years.

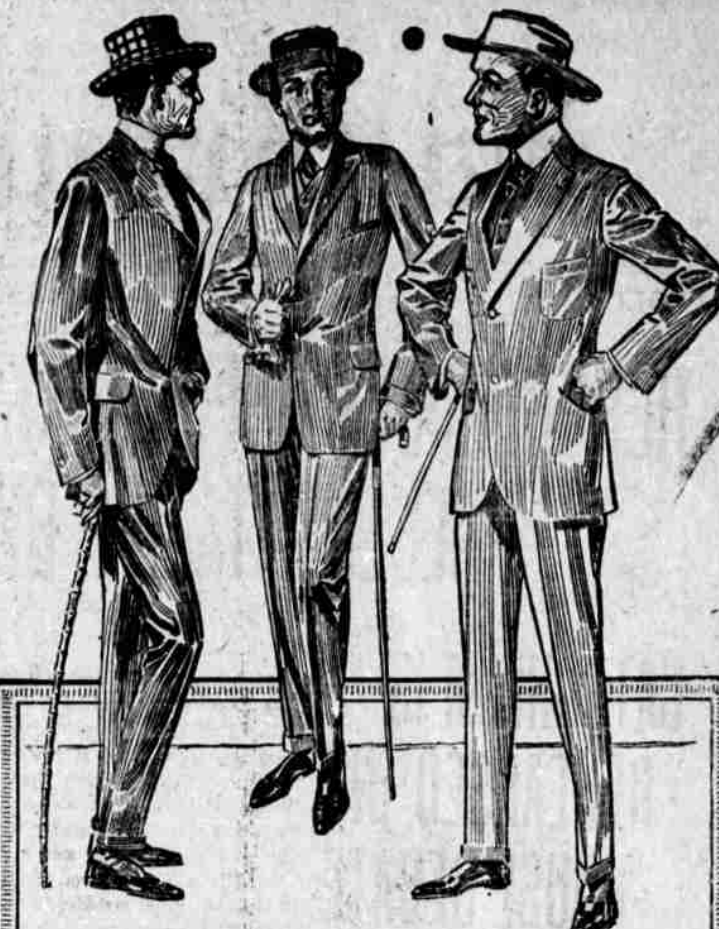
