Peace Congress Opens.
St. Louis, Mo., April 20.—The preliminary program of the Fourth American Peace Congress opens this evening at 8 o'clock when the Missouri oratorical contest of the Intercollegiate Peace Association will be held in Gorham Hall Chapel, Washington University. Contestants are entered from Central College, Fayette; St. Louis University, St. Louis; University of Missouri, Columbia; Washington University, St. Louis; Westminster College, Fulton, and William Jewell College, Liberty. A first prize of \$75 has been donated by the Intercollegiate Association. A second prize of \$50 will be given by the Fourth American Congress.

The real influx of hundreds of delegates and visitors to the congress began in earnest today. They came from fifteen central and southern American countries and from twenty-three of the state and territories of the Union. Eighteen affiliated peace societies of the United States will be officially represented when the congress opens its sessions Thursday. Thirty-nine educational institutions, including the most prominent colleges and universities of the United States will be represented as will also eight religious organizations and thirteen commercial associations. President Woodrow Wilson is honorary president of the congress. Honorary vice presidents are ex-President Taft, and United States Senator Elihu Root. Richard Bartholdt is president and will preside, and William J. Bryan, Secretary of State; Theodore E. Burton, Andrew Carnegie, Speaker Champ Clark, John W. Grigg and Oscar Strauss are vice presidents.

Sails for Egypt.
Paris, April 29.—Former Prefect of Police Lepins, probably the world's most famous police official and hunter of criminals, was booked to sail today for Egypt where he will take a long rest. Before he left, the ex-police official intimated that he might be drawn into the work of hunting down criminals when he returns to France after his vacation.
