the legislature they wanted an anti-alien land law," said a prominent legislator today. "They declared in many letters and telegrams that they didn't care how such a law was worded, or what diplomatic terms were used. The president said he desired that the words 'ineligible to citizenship, be not used. We have satisfied the people of California and the federal administration with this bill."

Bryan left at 8:15 for San Francisco where he will spend the day, the guest of exposition officials, and will return to Sacramento tomorrow. He was escorted to the station by Governor Johnson.

ing the anti-alien bill to be adopted by the California senate until he receives a detailed report from Bryan. The contents of Bryan's messages are not divulged. The president and acting Secretary of State Moore are keeping in close touch with developments at Sacramento.

Opinion is divided here regarding the success or failure of Bryan's mission to California. To change the phraseology of the bill defining what classes of aliens may own land, has complicated the situation. Counsellor Moore is inquiring whether the changed wording of the new bill violates the treaty with Japan.

### Japs are Conciliatory.

Prominent Japanese who are in a position to know informed the United Press that Japan would make no further diplomatic representations to the United States regarding its attitude until the California bill becomes a law. He said the attitude of Japan is most conciliatory, and that his country has not made a single representation to the United States which could be construed as an ultimatum.

### Bryan at Frisco.

San Francisco, April 30.—Bryan arrived at 11:30, to be the guest of exposition directors. On the train Bryan was averted to discuss the anti-alien legislation, and made no statement of any kind of the action of the California senate.
