MEADE FAILS TO APPEAR

ARSON SUSPECT HAS LEFT BAKER, IT SEEMS.

Changes Plea to Not Guilty and Has Taken Leave.

Baker, May 2.—(Special)—William R. Meade failed to appear in court yesterday morning at nine o'clock when his trial for setting fire to the White studio was set to take place, and in the opinion of the authorities Baker has seen the last of him. He changed his plea of guilty to not guilty on permission of Judge Anderson several days ago and left the city at once. As a matter of fact his case was not reached yesterday, but that was the date he supposed it was to be. It follows the Vaughan case, which was concluded yesterday. According to his attorney early last evening, he was due to arrive in Baker from Portland on

the late train, but if he did he failed to show himself to any of his friends.

It was stated by one of the county officials last evening that investigation developed the fact that Meade had prepared to take flight and that if he returns to face the music it will be a great surprise to those familiar with his plans. His bail in the sum of \$2000 will be forfeited to the county. According to officers, he returned only in hope of getting a parole and when that was refused took advantage of the court's permission to change his plea and skipped. However, his lawyer strongly asserts that he will return, but any rate he failed to appear when he was due.
