ADVENTISTS WILL GATHER

NORTHWEST SENDING DELEGATES TO WASHINGTON.

National Conference in Quadrennial Session in May.

Seventh-day Adventists in various parts of Southern Oregon are preparing to attend the quadrennial meeting of the general conference of that denomination which will be held in Washington, D. C., May 15 to June 8, and which will bring together believers in the faith from all parts of the world. A delegation of fifteen members will represent the North Pacific Union Conference, which takes in the states of Idaho, Oregon, Montana, and Washington.

Elder F. S. Bunch, the president, will represent the Southern Oregon conference, which has its headquarters at Roseburg. The others will be: Elders C. W. Flaiz, president of the union; L. Johnson, the president of the Western Washington conference; A. N. Dart, president of the Southern Idaho conference; P. A. Hanson, president of the Upper Columbia conference; W. J. Martin, religious liberty secretary of the North Pacific Union conference; M. E. Cady, secretary of the educational department; J. Riffel, head of the German department, and E. C. Kellogg, president, and F. W. Peterson, business manager of Walla Walla college; H. W. Becker, president of the Montana conference; H. W. Cottrell, president of West Oregon conference; J. F. Beatty, C. M. Everett, and W. R. Beatty of Portland, Oregon.

These persons will be among delegates that will represent every one of the 25 union conferences in the United States, Canada, Europe, Australia and Africa, and the mission stations in Africa and Asia. While the delegates will number between 300 and 500 the number of persons to attend will swell to about 4,000, and believers from all parts of North America will flock to the scene to listen to the important questions concerning the whole denomination which will come up for consideration, and the explanation of Bible themes by leading ministers of the faith.

Federal League Opens.

Pittsburg, May 6.—Cleveland versus Pittsburg, was the way they lined up here today, and it wasn't an scheduled contest. It was the opening exhibition game; it was a regularly of the newly organized Federal baseball league, the latest organization to try to bump the Kingdom of Organized Baseball.
