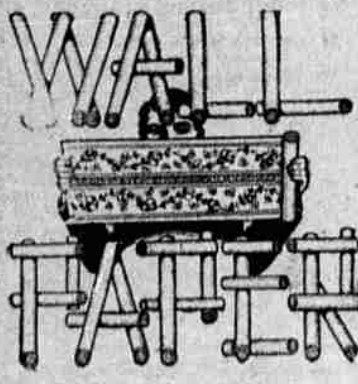

Observe Ascension Day.

London, May 6.—The third anniversary of the accession of King George to the British throne was celebrated today by the firing of military salutes in St. James's park. London. Similar artillery salutes also were fired at Windsor and at all the large military and naval stations. Warships along the coast "dressed ship" with luntings, and flags were flown on all government buildings and many business houses. King George and Queen Mary attended a memorial service for the late King Edward at the royal chapel at Frogmore and the king afterwards placed a wreath on his father's grave. The king is 48. He succeeded his father on May 6, 1910, and was crowned in Westminster Abbey June 22, 1911. He married Queen Mary in 1902 and has five sons and one daughter.
