

BEEF SELLS AT 14 1-2 RECORD

EGGS GOING INTO STORAGE AT
PORTLAND THIS WEEK.

Oranges Take Jump in the South,
Meaning Raise Here Soon.

Portland, May 14—(Special)—Con-

The extreme high record was
reached for fresh beef in the local
market today, when steer offerings
were quoting as high as 14 1/2 a pound
by local wholesalers. This is a sheer
advance of 1c a pound over the prev-

ious high mark, and fully confirms
the forecast made the day before.
