Home grown radishes—grown under direction of Chinese gardeners—went on the local market this morning and supplements the Walla Walla radishes which are also Chinese managed. There is little difference in the quality of the two sorts.

Strawberries are a shade lower. By purchasing two boxes, one saves five cents on the California fruit.
