Los Angeles, Cal., May 21.—Joe Mandot of New Orleans was knocked out in the 12th round of a scheduled 20 round fight here last night with Bud Anderson of Vancouver, Wash. Mandot was not knocked down at all in the final round, but he was practically "out" on his feet. He was clearly insensible. Referee Eytan seeing the condition of the game southerner, stopped the fight with Mandot staggering blindly about the ring, and held up Anderson's hand in token of victory for the Vancouver boy.

San Francisco, Cal., May 21.—Fifty pounds advantage in weight, six inches in height and a reach like the arm of a derrick could not win last night for Jess Willard from "Gunboat" Smith, who won the referee's decision in the last round of a 20-round bout. The heavier punch of the more experienced and aggressive veteran counted for more in the result than the talk and strength of his towering opponent. Inexperience lost the fight. Willard has strength and courage, but he was too good natured and sluggish.
