

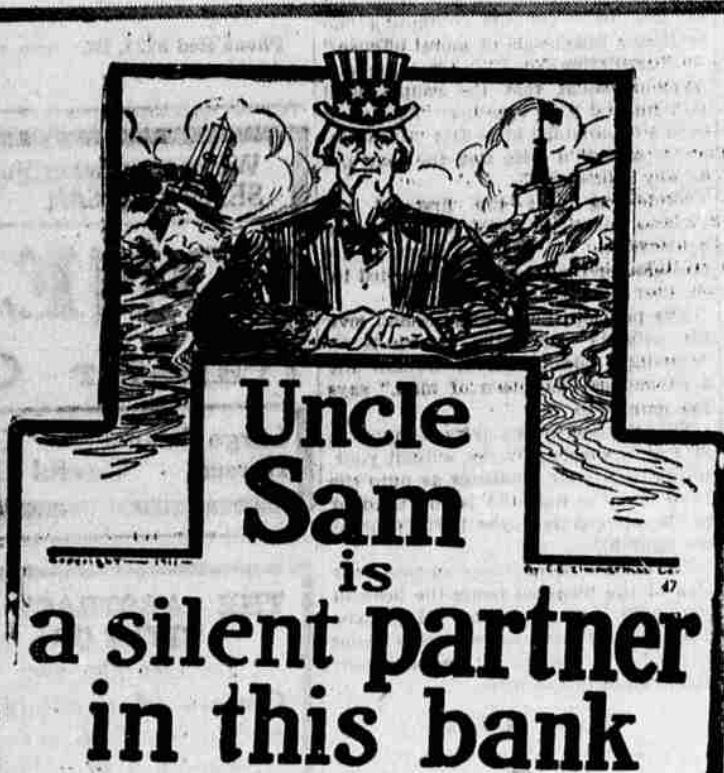

Gooseberries grown in Irrigon, the new community in Umatilla county, are being offered in the local markets this week. This fruit brings 25 cents for two boxes, and though not of the large kind seem crisp, tart and uniformly solid. These are the first offerings in the gooseberry line for the year.
