He had accused Mann of "rattling around, spouting mixed metaphors and vapid nothingnesses" and the house, always ready to laugh, was convulsed with laughter. Representative Hardy, of Texas, during a momentary pause, touched the orator on the sleeve and whispered earnestly to him. Thomas nodded, reached in his hip pocket and pulled out a plug of "chawin," which he passed over. Hardy took a generous bite and passed it back. ### Paving Injunction to Remain.

(Pendleton E. Q.)  
Until the supreme court has handed down a decision in the case of James Johns vs. the City of Pendleton, the temporary injunction which is holding up the paving of west Webb and Raley streets will be sustained. This much was intimated by Circuit Judge G. W. Phelps yesterday afternoon when the attorneys in the cases of J. J. Baumgardner vs. the City et al. and Elmer Reager vs. the City et al., concluded their arguments upon the motion to dissolve the injunction.

While the judge has not yet issued his ruling, he intimated strongly what it would be. He declared that, while he could see no reason why the temporary injunction should be sustained, he was of the opinion that no harm would result to either party if the injunction were left in force until the supreme court had decided the Johns case, in which the same question is involved. The plaintiffs in the Baumgardner and Reager cases contend that the patent on bitulithic precludes competition. R. R. Johnson and J. H. Raley are attorneys for the plaintiffs, while C. H. Carter

and J. A. Fee are representing the defendants.

Judge Phelps yesterday also overruled the demurrer filed by the defendants in the case of W. L. Thompson vs. Henry T. Hill and James Johns. In calling the docket the case of the Farmers Bank of Weston vs. J. K. Bartlett was dismissed without prejudice, that of S. A. Ash vs. D. C. Cowan was settled and dismissed and that of the Peoples Warehouse vs. A. H. Sunderman was dismissed at plaintiff's costs.
