

## CLASS GIVEN ITS DIPLOMAS

THINKING MAN SUPERIOR  
HOLDS EVENING'S SPEAKER

Auspicious Circumstances Attend  
Commencement Last Night.

Under circumstances that meshed one with another and auspicious in every detail, the 1913 class of the La Grande high school was graduated last evening at the school auditorium. Rev. E. B. Fyke, D. D. delivered the commencement address

using the class motto as his theme—"He most lives who thinks the most, feels the noblest, acts the best."

The long-awaited and well-earned laurel wreaths—sheepskins came as the climax to a program opened with a piano duet by Miss Lema Moss and Miss Ethel Pearson. Dr. A. G. Lane, D. D. delivered the invocation and Miss Blanche Perryman delivered the salutatory. This was followed by a mixed quartet of vocalists, Messrs. Bramwell and Ferrin, and Mesdames Geddes and Ferrin.

Rev. Fyke in his commencement address, analyzed the several clauses of the charter.

"Advancing civilization rides in the chariot of the world's thought and is the constantly enlarging life of the people," asserted the speaker. "The reason why no prophet (except he be divinely inspired) can forecast the future, is that he cannot tell what great thought the Infinite is going to drop into the

mind of some great leader. That falling from his lips it shall burn its way into the hearts of the masses, and breathe through their lives in deeds that shall quicken the step in the march of civilization. Every great invention that has had its influence on civilization; every great reformation in which great advancement has been made, has first struggled for formation and direction in the thought of some individual. God dropped into Luther's heart the thought of liberty in church and state, and this thought set empires trembling and thrones tottering. Cromwell's thought of personal right was a weapon strong enough to destroy that citadel of antiquity, namely, the divine right of kings. God dropped into the heart of a few oppressed people across the sea, the thought of liberty in a new world, and they braved the wilderness; and built their rude log huts; reared their families, and out of the thought

comes the greatest nation under heaven.

"The breaking waves dashed high on a stern and rock-bound coast

And the woods against the stormy sky their giant branches tossed, The heavy night hung dark, the hills and waters o'er,

When a band of exiles moored their bark on a wild and New England shore.

"What sought they thus afar, Bright jewels of the mind? The wealth of seas, the spoils of war. They sought a faith pure as shrine, ah! call it holy ground, They have left unstained what there they found, Freedom to worship God!"

Thinker a Worth While Being. "I have spoken thus to show you that he who thinks most, not only lives a larger life himself, but creates a larger life for those who live in his age, and in succeeding years. He who thinks most lives the largest individual life, for the largeness of life, as well as its longevity depends upon perfect correspondence with environment. Our complex nature requires that we correspond with physical, intellectual, and spiritual environment.

"He lives the largest physical life who by thought corresponds most perfectly with his physical environment. It may not be necessary for him to understand the chemical composition of the air he breathes, or give a chemical analysis of the water he drinks, but if he does understand these things his chance for a good physical basis for character, is increased.

"The man lives the largest intellectual life who corresponds with his intellectual environment," continued Mr. Fyke, "and one of the principles of intellect is thinking other men's thoughts over after them. Literature is a record of the best thoughts of the world's best thinkers, and literature with the record of God's thoughts in the universe makes an environment that may mean the ever increasing intellectual life of the individual.

"But the thoughts that are to grip the world must be warmed into feeling by the heart. Thought must have behind it passion, purpose, conviction. He who thinks most must feel noblest in order to make his thoughts effective."

Concluding, Mr. Fyke pointed out that thoughts and feelings dig deep the channel through which life's action's must flow. Thought and feeling invested in the world's work will bring a two-fold return; first to the investor, then to the world.

Miss Olive Massee sang a vocal solo, followed by the quartet. Earlier in the evening Miss Thelma Leffel sang a vocal solo and Prof. Olsan, principal of the school, representing the school board, presented the diplomas to the graduates. Rev. R. E. Close closed the delightful program with benediction and another class had gone forth from the La Grande high school.



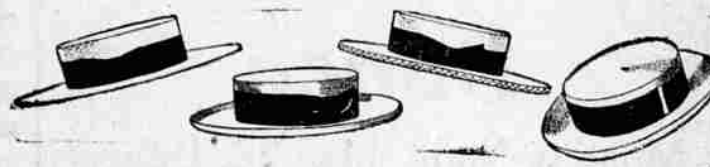
