LITTLE CHANGE FORM YESTERDAY PRICES IN LOCAL HOUSES.

Strawberries Selling for 20c, 2 for 35c, 3 for 50c.

Conditions in the local markets are practically the same as yesterday. Due to the increase in the growth of strawberries during the last few days and the prospects of fresh territories coming into the market, that fruit is beginning to prepare for a cut in prices. Present quotations are 20c per box, 2 for 25c and 3 for 50c.
