Claims to Be Personal Representative of Wilson and Bryan.

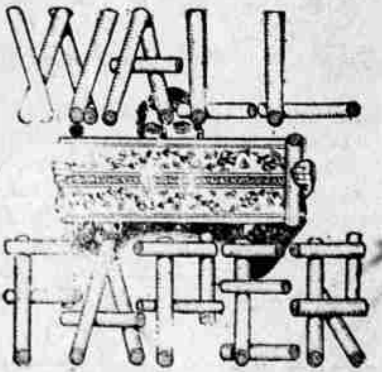
