FITCHNER LOSES OWN GAME BY
SKIPPING SECOND.

Walla Walla, June 11.—(Special).—Neglecting to touch second base after poling out a three-bagger at the opening of the sixth inning, probably cost Fitchner his own game yesterday, for the score would have been tied, and since the Bears were unable to do anything against his delivery, the chances favored the Spuds.

It was the fastest game ever played in Walla Walla, both teams and pitchers working like machines, while the work of Fitchner was remarkable. He passed through the Bear batting order like a motor cycle Mike, on his tour of the world, obtaining 11 strikeouts, passing but one man to first, and allowing but three wee hits.

Welsh worked in almost equally as good form but his support was a trifle stronger and no scratch hits got through, Lundstrom, Childers and Davis figuring in several fast plays.

Walla Walla's first run came in the first inning. Harmon singled and was sent to second by Childers' sacrifice, taking third on fielder's choice of Davis' grounder to short, he later scored on a passed ball by Conroy while Martini was striking out.

The Spuds had another opportunity to score in the eighth when Peterson led off with a hit. Naughton was out on a third bunt strike out, and Conroy hit. Welsh then made a wild pitch advancing both runners and with but one down things looked bad, but Fitchner fled to Harmon and Corbin went out, Welsh to Sheely.

Fitchner did his most splendid work in the eighth when he retired the side on strikeouts, whiffing Brown with two on and Harmon and Childers with the bases full, Johnson and Welsh having hit and Lundstrom walked.

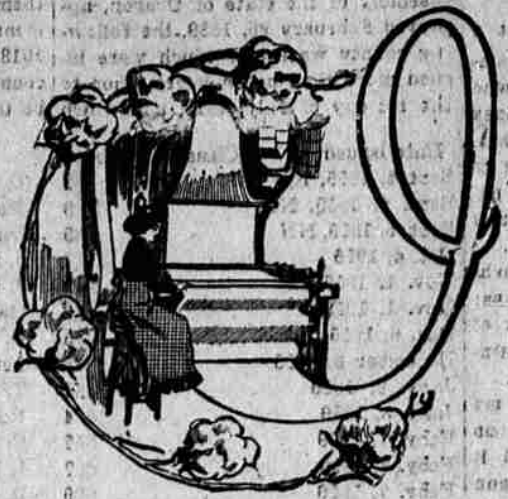
