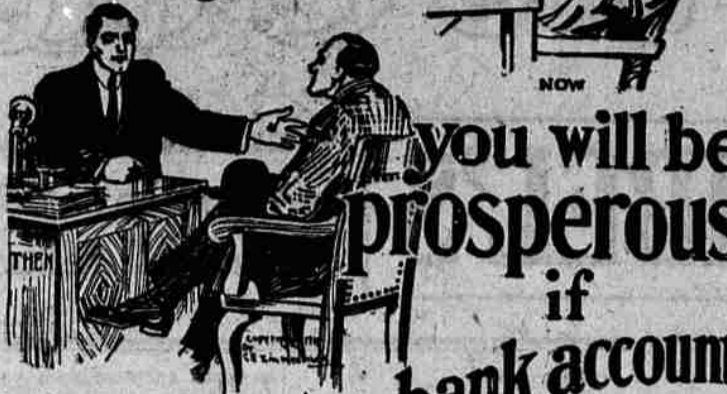

ADVANCED METHODS USED IN WALLOWA.

W. C. T. U. of Wallowa County Will Meet Next Week.

Enterprise, June 12.—(Special)—The county W. C. T. U. will convene at Joseph, Thursday, June 19, at which Ada Wallace Unruh, state president of the Temperance Union, will be present. Mrs. W. W. White, this city, will read a paper entitled, "The Needs of the Field." Mrs. Rogers will also give a short talk on "Organized Temperance Work a Necessity." A large attendance from all towns in the valley is assured, and each one will be represented by three or more women, who will thoroughly discuss the efficiency of the work of the Temperance Union.

Besides the re-flooring of several porches, the lawn has gained added attractiveness from the choice shrubbery and costly flowers artistically arranged.

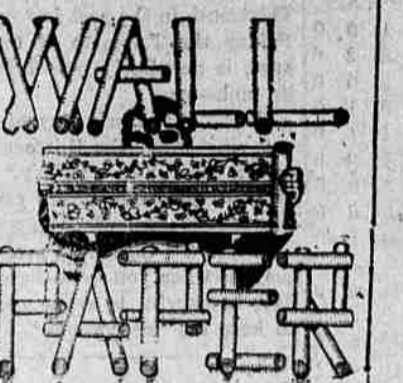

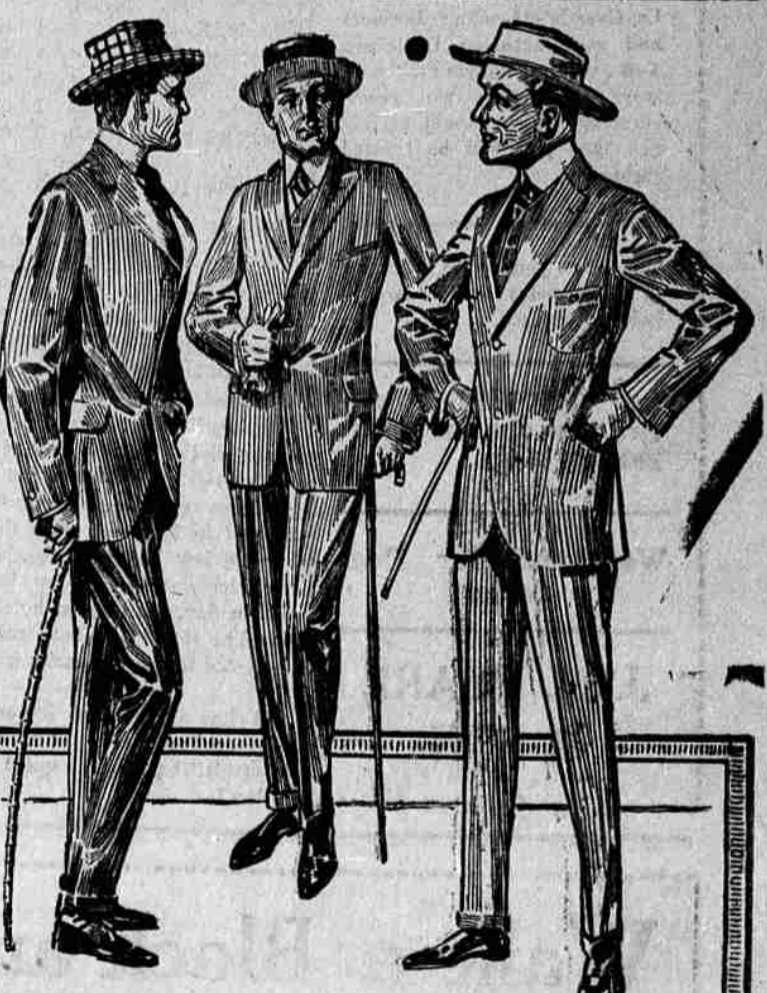
