

BAUMGARDT A MAN OF TALENT

SAVANT HAS BIG LINE OF LECTURES.

Fjords of Norway, Astronomy, and America First, Themes.

A most interesting, educational and entertaining lecturer who appears at the Grande Ronde Chautauqua this year is Mr. Baumgardt of international repute.

Mr. Baumgardt is himself a scientist of note, and is ex-president of the Southern California Academy of Sciences. His entire series of lectures comprise something like one hundred in number, all of which bear directly upon art, travel, science and the history of human civilization. A list of the colleges and schools at which Mr. Baumgardt has lectured would easily fill this page, and it would not be confined to America alone, for Mr. Baumgardt is abroad a part of every year.

Astronomy Speech Fine.

"An Evening With the Stars," is one feature lecture. No pains have been spared to make this lecture an intellectual and artistic treat. The stereopticon views are from celestial negatives obtained principally at the Yerkes and Lick observatories by world-renowned astronomers.

In this lecture are shown the most wonderful pictures of the moon and of all of the planets in their respective orbits and distances from the sun. The strange satellite systems of Jupiter and Saturn are dealt with in detail. Comets, double, triple and quadruple stars, mysterious and fantastic nebulae, those chaotic, primordial beginnings of other solar systems, clusters and colonies of stars situated on the very confines of the creation, make this a scientific masterpiece. At one time no less than one hundred and fifty thousand stars are shown upon the screen, all suns which in all probability, are surrounded with retinues of planets and satellites similar to our own.

Mr. Baumgardt has another most interesting lecture which may be presented, if desired, in place of the one on Norway. This lecture is of our own country.

"See America First."

This most interesting series of views showing some of the most remarkable American scenery will be shown if desired, as a prologue. Included are views of the Yellowstone National park, the Yosemite, the Grand Canyon of the Colorado, and California.

In January of this year Mr. Baumgardt visited Portland at the request of, and under the auspices of the Portland school board, and delivered a series of lectures in the school of that city. They were most favorably reviewed and commented upon by the Portland Oregonian, the Portland Journal and the Evening Telegram. He will deliver either of two lectures at the Chautauqua.

FARMERS DAY SET.

The Farmers' union and the Granges will conduct no program as they did last year, but on Monday, June 30, C. L. the well known C. L. Smith, professor of agriculture for the O. Dinner will be served on the grounds at nominal prices, or the farmers can bring their lunches and buy coffee on the grounds, making a picnic of the day.

C. L. Smith, the agriculturist of the Oregon-Washington Railroad & Navigation company will spend the entire week at the Chautauqua, especially for the purpose of aiding the farmers at home to solve the problems with which they are confronted.

Any farmer who has a problem, either in a contrary soil, seed, fruit, or stock raising should come to the Chautauqua and have a personal talk with Mr. Smith. He will give lectures on farming subjects and personal talks on individual problems, peculiar to La Grande's farming territory.
