LOOKING DOWN**

HOGS THE EXCEPTION, HOLD PRICES WELL.

Various Causes Responsible for Tending Recline.

Due to several contributing causes the live-stock market is falling rapidly. Although the quality of the offerings are up to standard, and the demand fully normal, the brokers have used the Australian frozen beef scare to their best advantage and have succeeded in reducing quotations on live stock in general. Hogs remaining the exception are holding prices firm and there is no anticipation for a fall in pork.

Beef prices during the last 13 months have been higher in the United States than any at any time in the past 15 years and while it will mean a loss to stock raisers, conditions indicate that beef must fall to a normal level before long.

In the local markets all sheep and cattle have fallen off on the average of one cent per pound during the past week.
