Strawberries that are grown on the outskirts of La Grande are showing the best quality and size of any berry that has this year been offered the consuming public. Since the local berry has become somewhat plentiful there has been a decline in crate lots but the single box is still selling for what the Easterner calls a shilling. The crate sells for \$2.50. Cove berries have not been generally needed to fill out the supply for the local growers have flooded the market the past day of two with a very fine grade and there has been no occasion to go beyond the home berry, though the local supply will probably give out before the Cove berries are gone. Late today some stores sold crates for \$2.25.
