- ◆ This includes fancy homegrown stuff, Cove berries and shipped in varieties.

First tomatoes—meaning thereby real tomatoes—are being handled by a few of the marketmen today. The Barlow hot house of Elgin sent down a shipment of tomatoes last night that are extra choice. The tomatoes were even-sized, juicy and smooth. They are much better than the California stuff and Mexican brands offered earlier. These tomatoes sell for 25 cents a pound and two pounds for 45 cents.
