# Two Days of Big Fun

### LAND DEAL CLOSED.

Thirty Thousand Dollar Deal Completed at Wallowa.

Wallowa, Ore., June 20.—One of the biggest deals effected in this county was practically completed when John McDonald traded 2500 acres of and on Dry Creek to Jacob Weinhard of Dayton, Wash., for 100 acres of alfalfa land on the Touchet river, three miles from Dayton. It is understood that the deal involved something like \$30,000. The ranch which Mr. McDonald takes possession of near Dayton, consists of a seven-acre orchard highly cultivated and with all modern improvements. The Dry Creek ranch which Mr. Weinhard receives comprises about 2500 acres of land with about 600 acres under cultivation, the remainder of which consists of timber and grazing land. The deal was consummated by L. Couch, Wallowa's real estate man.

### Platt Funeral Held.

The funeral of Albert Platt was held yesterday at the M. E. church South, conducted by Rev. Nelson. There was a large attendance and many beautiful flowers showing the high esteem in which the family is held by this community.

Mr. Platt was born in Pennsylvania in 1865, and at his death, June 16th, was 48 years 3 months and 11 days. He is survived by his wife and three daughters; one grandson here in La Grande and two sisters and three brothers in Pennsylvania.
