CALIFORNIA VARIETY BRINGS
GOOD STUFF.

Two Pounds for 25 Cents Is Introductory Price for Them.

Peaches are the very latest thing in market circles. A shipment has come from California, that, while still high, gives the first taste of the mid-summer delicious fruit. Two pounds for 25 cents is the market quotations while still above the average pocket-book adds variety and tone to the market offerings by La Grande grocers.

Hog Prices Stronger.

Hog prices jumped 15c in the Portland market yesterday. There was only a fair run available for the trade at the opening of the market and bids for top stuff were quickly raised to \$8.75.

With the exception of Chicago, which ruled a dime above what the Portland market was quoting, North Portland was paying a better price for swine yesterday than any other American stockyard center.

At Chicago there was a firmer tone generally in the hog trade with an advance of 5c to 10c in the price.

Kansas City hog markets ruled firm with an advance of a nickel over yesterday.

South Omaha hog market ruled strong with an advance of 5c to 10c for the day.
