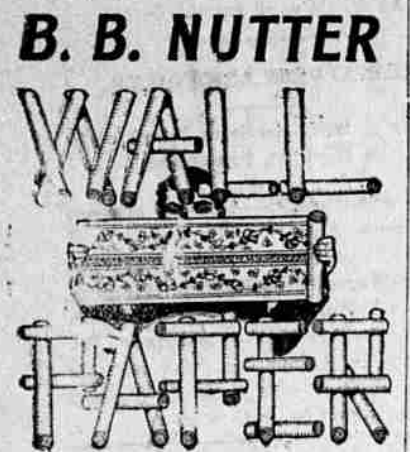

The meeting will be held on July 8 and at that time President Swift will be here from the state organization and Mr. Sikes the well known organizer and secretary, will also be in attendance.

nominal note will be struck. It is worth repeating that this assembly will be in many respects the most significant gathering of Christian forces thus far in history.

A prominent feature of the Conference will be a great patriotic demonstration on the Fourth of July. No nation is really great without patriotism. Independence Day has a particular and peculiar significance to the citizens of this Republic. Its institutions and its methods are copied and its history is replete with stirring incidents. Notable Americans will tell of national accomplishments and eminent men from abroad will narrate how this nation has been helpful to others.

Cordial welcome awaits the coming of the delegates and their friends. The new West extends a greeting to the people of the old world and the men of renown of the home land, and will hear with listening ears the messages they bring.

Distinguished men from our own and other lands will be present and take part in the discussions of the Conference and topics of national and world-wide interest will be presented by commissions previously appointed, who will bring the fruits of special study and investigation before the assemblage.

The meetings of the Conference will be held in the Multnomah Stadium and in the churches of the city.

H. C. Minton, D. D. LL. D., of Thenton, N. J., president of the National Reform association, who, for months has been in Europe and on the continent, securing speakers of international reputation, will preside at all stadium meetings. Regarding the subjects to be considered, and the men to participate in this conference, Dr. Minton has said:

"Representative men from all Christian countries are to be invited and welcomed to this International Symposium on Christian Citizenship. Peace

and War, Emigration and Immigration, Education and Religion, the Family and Divorce, Prison Reform and Civil Service, Social Conscience and Personal Character, the Obligations and Observance of one Holy Day in Seven, the Physical and Spiritual Evils of Intemperance and How to Meet Them, Social Evils and Their Preventives and Remedies and Dependents, the Ethical Values of Christianity and the Christian Presuppositions of a Sound Ethic—these and many other vital themes will be considered, not with a view to the trying out of certain theories simply, but to the end that a better understanding may be reached, a mutual advantage from past experiences derived, and a broader and higher platform of Christian Citizenship everywhere permanently achieved."
