## SUGAR GOES UP 20 CENTS

RISE OF A WEEK AGO SUPPLEMENTED THIS MORNING.

Twenty Cents In a Week's Time Is Sudden Spurt In Sugar.

In a week's time sugar has gone up 20 cents on the sack. A week ago the price shot 10 cents and this morning came another boost of 10 cents—on the eve of "free sugar" at that. The cane varieties sell for \$5.80, cash, today and beet sugar is correspondingly higher.

Blackberries, raspberries, dewberries and blackcaps are late additions to the berry offerings by local people. Walla Walla supplying the berries noted above. Little change is taking place nevertheless in other lines of berries, and one of the few commodities going down is new potatoes now obtainable for five cents per pound.
