**WHEAT PRICE IS INCREASING**

SLIGHT RISE AND BULLISH ATTITUDE SEEN.

Political Situation, Reported Shortage, Held Responsible.

Chicago, July 5.—Wheat options opened with an advance of 1-4c to 3-8c a bushel for the day. There was some short coverings due to the reports from the central west that much damage has been done the crops recently.

Broomhall cabled from Liverpool that the wheat market advanced on unfavorable reports from France, less favorable weather, Russia, and unfavorable political news from eastern Europe. There was prominent outside speculative support.
