SEVENTEEN MEN WHIFFED BY O. A. C. LAD.

How Can't Solve Offerings and Then Help Culver Win Besides

La Grande Moose yesterday handed Wallowa a 6-2 score game in the branchline league in a somewhat farcical contest in which the pitching of the young collegiate twirler, Culver (O. A. C.) was the chief and redeeming feature. Culver beat La Grande almost lonehanded, for he had the Moose on his hip from the start and set a new branchline league record by trotting back to the bench chanting in allegorical the old Walter Johnson hymn of misery: "You can't hit what you can't see." Culver uses plenty of steam and mixes in a little quick-breaking curve that completely befuddled the home guard. Foster opened the game but punk support and off-color pitching together soon necessitated a switch and Oliver did a little better in the two innings he worked. Wallowa put three over in the third while the Moose were trying their very best to heave the ball out of the lot. Culver had doubled, and probably deserved to score but the costly errors in two other men. In the first inning Wallowa had scored once on a long drive, errors, etc., but the Moose had tied in with L. Culver's free transportation, a daring double steal and Johnson's error completing the responsibility. The Moose scored again in the seventh when Culver showed the only signs of any weakness that really amounted to a hill of beans. R. Culver had doubled and stolen third and came home when Foster hit into a fielder's choice because Maxwell lost his head and got neither Oliver coming from third nor Foster at first.

In the ninth Holmes hit into a fielder's choice, took second on error and home on Maxwell's long single. The Moose ended the ninth inning with a fast double and this was the only fielding event of any feature on either side, for the Wallowa fielders didn't have to with the form Culver was using and it is doubtful if the Moose could have done it over again.
