## NEW SPUDS ON DOWN GRADE

PRICES SLOWLY SINKING FOR  
BEST GRADES.

Stringbeans Sell at 10 Cents—Bulk of  
Vegetables Firm.

Only a few slight changes are noted in the local markets today. The bulk of the vegetables remain at the same prices. New potatoes have dropped a cent and are now selling for 5 cents per pound. Young turnips are wanted at 3 for 10c and cucumbers at 15 cents each. Stringbeans are selling at 10 cents per pound. Berries are plentiful and all but strawberries are selling at 2 for 15c. Strawberries are still 10 cents. A plentiful supply of all green vegetables is reported at the local markets this morning.
