Pendleton, July 8.—Pendleton ended the first half of the Western Tri-State schedule in the third place position. On that rung of the ladder when the La Grande and Baker clubs withdrew from the league she maintained it during the final two weeks.

During the eleven weeks of play, the local team has won more than half her games. Except the two series with Walla Walla and the last one with Boise, which they lost five to one, the Buckaroos have won every series in which they have participated and the showing is pleasing to the fans.

Today the second half of the season will begin with Pendleton playing in Boise and Wall Walla playing in North Yakima. The slates will be wiped clean and the clubs start all over again. Last week the Bucks went into a batting slump and won but one game of six. Unless they strike a better clip this week, they will get off with another bad start.

Pendleton opens here next week with the Walla Walla team and follows the week after with the Yakima Braves as opponents. Then will follow a series each in Walla Walla, Boise and North Yakima in the order named, after which Boise will come here for the final series on the home grounds, unless perchance, one of the North Yakima series is switched.
