BOY SHOT TO DEATH.

Baker Lad and Sunnyslope Youth Playing With Deadly Weapon. Baker, July 9.—Taking a loaded 22 calibre rifle from the hands of his companion, 15-year-old Cundiff, near the Sunnyslope ditch above the Valley avenue hill yesterday afternoon, Gerald Moody, the 10-year-old son of Mr. and Mrs. Orson Moody of this city was instantly killed when the weapon was set off accidentally. Which one of the boys was responsible for firing the shot, if either, the Cundiff lad the survivor of the tragedy, cannot say.

The boys were out hunting, and the Cundiff boy had just shot at a mark, according to his story, and handed the weapon to his companion when the fatal accident occurred. He says that the injured boy fell to the ground and was breathing although unconscious. He hastened to the city at once and, accompanied by A. B. Hager and his uncle, Walter Cundiff, went at once to the scene of the shooting in Hager's automobile.

The Cundiff boy was more or less excited and unable to locate the exact spot where he left the other lad and it took about three-quarters of an hour to find him, and when the searchers came upon the body, he had been dead for some time. Coroner West was at once notified and brought the remains to the undertaking parlors, but deemed an inquest unnecessary.

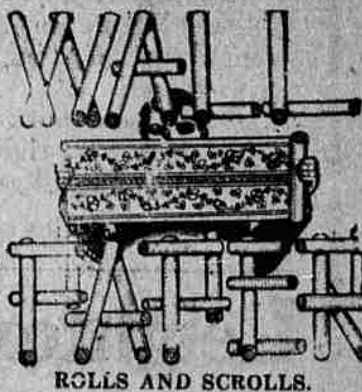
