IN FULL TILT

LARGE ACREAGE OF HAY WILL BE TOP NOTCH.

Some of That Rained on Will Be Feedable—Hay Rush Under Way Now.

First crop alfalfa in this valley is not going to be a total loss. Of the several hundred acres of hay cut down just before and during the recent prolonged rain, some at least will be sufficient in quality to feed without total loss and some will be salable. Furthermore there are hundreds of acres of alfalfa under the cutting process this week, many farmers having several mowers going at full tilt during the present good weather. Some fields have not been touched yet and having rain the next few days there will be top notch hay crops along the Sandridge especially. Over the lowlands the percentage of hay spoiled is greater but north of a line between La Grande and Cove, and to some extent south of it, there are hundreds of acres of fine alfalfa fields that have been cut since sunshine became the order of the day and unless caught at the last end of the process, hundreds of tons of hay will be cut and cured without so much as a drop of water. In several places, the hay that was caught by the wind-up of the prolonged rains, will be feedable, though perhaps not salable.
