

PENDLETON AUTOIST HURT

AUTOMOBILE TOPPLES OVER A HIGH EMBANKMENT.

Occupants of Machine Badly Hurt— Fatalities Barely Averted.

Otto Houser, well known young man of this city, and Miss Florence Baker of Seattle, are today lying in the St. Anthony hospital with serious injuries as a result of an automobile accident which occurred late last evening on the McKay creek grade south of the city, says the Pendleton E. O. That they or other members of the party were not killed is a good fortune almost unaccountable.

The escape of young Houser was only by a hair's breadth for his jugular vein was bared by the blow which laid open the whole left side of his face and broke his jaw bone. Had it been severed he would have bled to death in five minutes, according to the attending physician.

Miss Baker suffered a fracture of her left arm between the elbow and the shoulder and a severe wrench of the back. The other members of the party, Misses Claire McDonald and Vivian Casey, Archie Rugg and John Hinderman, escaped with only bad bruises.

The cause of the accident, as explained by the young people, was a catch in the steering gear which made the driver, young Rugg, powerless to control it. It happened as the car was climbing the grade beyond the Alex Hudson ranch on McKay creek and when the machine was going at a very moderate rate of speed. Suddenly, say members of the party, it swerved and resisted all of the efforts of the driver to turn it back into the road. Almost before they realized their danger it had plunged over the grade and turned over three times before it finally came to a stop in the ditch.

Miraculous Escape.
Several of the occupants were precipitated clear of the car. Some portion of the machine evidently struck Houser a raking blow just back of the jaw. Miss Baker was pinned by the car and when it was lifted from her one arm fell helplessly to her side. Miss Casey was saved from injury by the fact that young Houser lighted in such a manner as to keep the force of the car off her. Rugg fell in such a position that had the car struck an inch or two nearer he would have been seriously injured if not killed. The escape of Hinderman and Miss McDonald were equally miraculous.
