NEW SUPERINTENDENT COMES

Future Executive of La Grande Public Schools Arrives With Family.

Prof. John Girdler who succeeds J. D. Stout as superintendent of La Grande schools, arrived this morning from Glenwood Springs and will locate here permanently. He is accompanied by his family.

Unidentified Man Dies.

Found unconscious at the Umatilla depot, a stranger whose name is believed to have been Albert Thomas, was placed aboard No. 2 last evening but expired shortly before reaching this city. The body was taken to the Baker undertaking parlors and efforts are being made today to locate his relatives, relates the Pendleton East Oregonian.

In one of his pockets was found a membership card of the Western Federation of Miners bearing the name of Albert Thomas. It signifies that the owner had at various times been a member of the Kennett, Silver Peak, Tonopah, Manhattan, Round Mountain and Butte unions and telegrams have been sent to the unions in an endeavor to locate the man's home.

He was about forty years old, dressed like a laborer and indications were that he had been "beating" his way on the trains. The nature of the illness from which he died has not been ascertained.
