

POTATOES ARE SCARCE

GOVERNMENT ESTIMATES SHOW 55.2 PERCENT CROP.

This Year, on 100 Per Cent Basis, the Crop Was 117 Per Cent Yield.

Potatoes will be scarce in 1913 if the government has called the turn right, as per the current issue of the government crop reports. The estimate for the present year is 55.2 crop on a 100 per cent basis as compared to actual figures of last year of 117 per cent. NOTICE OF SEWER IMPROVEMENT.

TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:

You will hereby take notice that in pursuance of a resolution duly adopted by the council of the city of La Grande, Oregon, on the 4th day of June, 1913, creating sewer district No. 2, section 3, and designating and declaring the real property hereinafter described as included in and comprising said district, and in pursuance of a resolution duly adopted by said city council on the 4th day of June, 1913, whereby said city council determined the necessity of and declared its intention to improve said district and all the real property included therein as hereinafter described by laying therein a sewer and in pursuance of the report of the commissioners heretofore made in relation thereto, and adopted by said council, the city council of the city of La Grande, Oregon, will meet at the council chamber of said city on the 16th day of July, 1913, at the hour of 8 o'clock p. m. of said day, and consider the levy of a special assessment against all the real property benefited or affected by said proposed improvement, and grant a hearing before said council to all persons feeling aggrieved on account of said proposed levy of said special assessment to pay the costs and expenses thereof.
