HOME GROWN TOMATO FINE

LA GRANDE AND ELGIN MEETS LOCAL DEMANDS.

Hay Crop In Baker County Promises to Be High Grade and Valuable.

Home producers are largely supplying the tomato consumption. The La Grande Floral company has been producing first class tomatoes for several days and though they lack the finish and uniformity of the regular season product, are a very good quality for this time of the year. Elgin concerns have been assisting in this supply for the past two weeks or so, and hereafter it will not be necessary for distributors to obtain out of county tomatoes for any material length of time even in the early season.

With the dry weather continuing since the Fourth, ranchers of Baker county are in the midst of a prosperous haying season.

Flattering prices for green alfalfa hay are reported, ranging from \$8 to \$10 per ton, which would mean about \$12 to \$14 per ton if the hay was cured.

Eagle valley and a portion of the Burnt river country lost a little hay from the rains. Pine valley being effected but little by the moisture. Hay in Powder river valley was not damaged in the least.
