# POTATO BUG SCARE GROWS

## WASHINGTON COUNTIES FEEL POTATO PEST.

From Nez Perce County They Spread to Surrounding Fields.

For several years past the Colorado potato beetle has been known to occur in the Nez Perce country in Idaho, the only locality in which it was known west of the Rocky mountains. During 1911 and '12 some few were reported in different sections of the Palouse country. This year they are found quite generally in most all parts of the Inland Empire. In some gardens there are thousands of them.

Most people know this potato "bug," but for those who do not a brief description is here given of the various stages. The adult beetle is about the size and shape of half a pea with the round side uppermost. It is yellow in color with the wing covers ornamented with ten longitudinal black stripes. The larva or immature stage is a pale red "slug," soft, plump and slimy, and very disgusting in appearance. The eggs are about as large as the head of a pin, are orange colored, and are deposited in clusters on the underside of the leaves.

The beetles live over winter in the adult stage, hibernating deep under ground. When the potatoes come up in the spring the beetles emerge from the ground and feed upon the young leaves and vines. After a few days they lay their eggs on the underside of the leaves. The eggs hatch in about a week into tiny red larvae which feed on the plants and grow to maturity in about three weeks. Just before they turn into the striped "bugs" the larvae go into the ground, where they undergo an intermediate stage and emerge as mature striped beetles. These beetles lay their eggs (300 to 500) and a second crop of larvae begins to devour the potato vines. All stages of the potato beetle may be found at any time.

In those states where the potato beetle has gained a stronghold it is necessary for the grower to spray at least a couple of times each season in order to save his crop. Should the beetle gets a foothold it will be necessary to do it here, thus incurring additional expense in raising potatoes in this part of the country. They are unknown now in the Grand Ronde valley.

It is better to kill one beetle now than 500 this fall, or than over a million next spring. The time to kill them is NOW before they change into adult beetles with wings to carry themselves from field to field.

There are two equally effective remedies against this pest. One can spray the vines thoroughly with either arsenate of lead, one pound to 35 gallons of water, or with Paris green, 1 pound to 75 gallons of water. Both are quite effective and if properly applied the beetles eating of either should be dead inside of 24 hours.

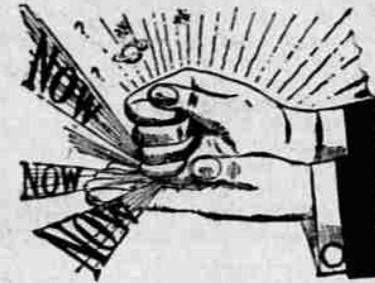
