Non-Militants Invade London.

London, July 25.—The advance guard of what is expected to be the greatest woman suffrage demonstration England has ever seen, arrived in the British capital today. All are opposed to militant methods. The non-militant organizations represented have a total membership of nearly 50,000. Many of those who will arrive tomorrow in time for the demonstration have "hiked" all the way to London. Some of them walked 300 miles, having started the pilgrimage weeks ago. Mrs. Millicent G. Fawcett, president of the National union, will preside at all meetings.
