Mr. and Mrs. Will Morrison of Weston, who have been camping at Wallowa lake, stopped off here with Mrs. Schilke on their way home.

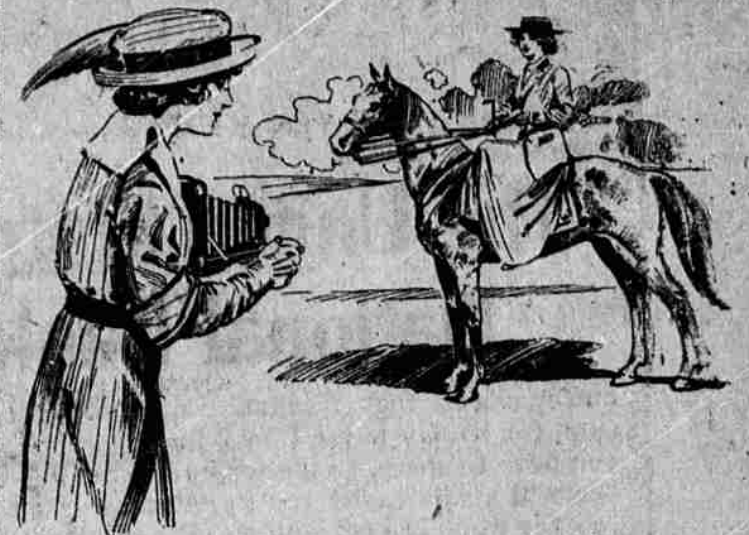
