Curtain for Oldest Theatre.  
 Philadelphia, July 25.—The oldest in the United States today is and after 104 consecutive seasons never open its doors again. Famous old Walnut street theatre Ninth and Walnut streets, has fallen under the ban of the Philadelphia fire inspector. Because of equipment for fire protection and prevention its managers have been refused a license which would reopen it for the 105th season in the fall. Next September will be the first September in over a century that the doors of the Walnut street theatre will not reopen.

The Walnut street theatre stage has been played on by all the celebrated actors and actresses from Edmund Keen down to the present day crop of celebrities. It was the first structure of its kind built in America as a place of amusement. Erected on what was then the outskirts of little old Philadelphia in 1808, it was a large riding school and the scene of equestrian performances. Pepin and Breschard opened the building as the New Circus February 2, 1809. With the exception of the front wall which was rebuilt in 1828, the original walls are still standing. When the novelty of the equestrian performances were out, stage productions were added and the name changed to the Olympic theatre. It was in January 1812 that the first play was produced on the stage. It was "The Rival."

LOCAL DEALERS OUT AND NO SUPPLY IN SIGHT.  
 Scarcity Exists in Portland Market Too Is Reported.

**FREESTONE PEACHES COME**  
 Southern Oregon is supplying freestone peaches to local dealers today and though the price stays up well, the quality is good. The Milton clingstone type is not as choice as the yellow Crawfords that come from Southern Oregon. The express rates are higher than on the Milton berries and the local distributors have to charge more for the commodity. Cherries have taken a drop from 10 cents to 5 cents or 25 cents per gallon.

Watermelon supplies are exhausted in La Grande and wholesalers have no definite assurance when they will receive another shipment. The fruit is still quoted at 3 cents here but there are no melons. In Portland the wholesale price is 2 1-2 cents and if the stringency in supply continues it is not impossible that prices will go up. While they have no added supplies in sight dealers who handle the fruit in carload lots hope to see a shipment headed their way before long.
