ROUND-UP DIRECTORS THINK BEST HORSES STOLEN.

Angel, Who Minor Conquered, and Rambling Sam, Among Missing.

Pendleton, July 29.—There is weeping and wailing and gnashing of teeth in the camp of the Round-up directors and there is good and sufficient cause for it. Three of the best bucking horses of the association have disappeared and it is the belief that they have been stolen. Angel, the famous outlaw upon whom L. W. Minor made his championship side, Rambling Sam, who rambles some, and Whistling Annie, the same that made Tex McLeod bite the dust at the Round-up last year have vanished from the pasture on McKay creek, where the Round-up stock is kept eleven months out of the year.

They were missed some time ago and it was thought at that time that they had wandered far back on the range but search fails to find them. Reluctantly the directors have come to the belief that they have been stolen and 500 circular letters have been sent over eastern Oregon describing the animals and offering a reward of \$25 for the return of each by September 1. President Til Talyor, who also happens to be sheriff, had all of his deputies keeping their eyes "peeled" for signs of the missing beasts. Angel is valued at \$1000, Rambling Sam at \$800 and Whistling Annie at \$750 but they would not be worth that except to a show similar to the Round-up.
