## MAKE A NOTE

Stove Moved; Breakfast Cooked. Baker, Aug. 8.—With the novel request that he order the arrest of an officer of the law, Mrs. Emma Howard appeared before District Attorney Goodwin yesterday noon with fire in her eye and vengeance in her soul at what she termed unjust and cruel treatment at the hands of an officer. It seems that Mrs. Howard, according to her story, was occupying a house on Tenth street owned by Mrs. [Name]. Having failed to pay the rent, the latter brought action to have her ejected. The matter came up before Justice of the Peace Hubbard yesterday morning and he issued the order of ejection, and in the absence of Constable Palmer, appointed R. A. Yantis, as special officer to carry out the order of the court. With an assistant, he came to the house, Mrs. Howard claims, and began moving out her effects. She did not lay so much stress on the mere fact that she was being put out, but the straw that broke the camel's back was when they lifted out the kitchen stove with the beef-steak in the spider frying for dinner. This was the last straw, she says, and prompted her hurried trip to the district attorney. She received little consolation, however, and after half an hour went on her way, as Brother Goodwin allowed that the law must take its course and that in any event he could hardly establish a local precedent by ordering the arrest of a limb of the law.

Baltimore, Aug. 8.—Ascending the Garden City of Long Island on a race to Washington and return at 4:31 this morning Aviator Marvin Wood raced the special train to Baltimore, leading by 15 minutes.
