STATE GAME COMMISSIONERS OUTLINE SCHEME.

Warning Signals and Proper Clothing Advocated for Hunters.

A "CUTOUT" SUMMARY OF HUNTING CODE.

The following is a condensed table of signals to be used by all Sportsmen when lost:

Begin with 1 shot, wait 10 seconds, repeat 1 shot, wait 60 seconds, repeat 1 shot. Wait 5 minutes before giving the second signal.

Answer to signal by rescuing party, 1 shot. Recognition of answer by man lost, 1 shot.

The state board of fish and game commissioners has recommended the following suggestions to be used by sportsmen in the field in order to prevent accidental shooting and to relieve persons who are injured or lost in the forests and mountains, in a letter to Dr. Geo. Zimmerman, president of the Wing, Fin and Fleetfoot club.

To prevent accidental shooting, every hunter should wear a red cap, shirt or sweater, or some other article of clothing that can easily be identified from game birds and animals, especially when hunting deer in the forests.

Since there is a contrast between red and the color of any bird or animal that is being hunted, this color will serve the best purpose.

Hunters should never shoot at moving brush, leaves or grass with the expectation of killing game. It is dangerous, for the moving object is likely to be a man. Never shoot at any object until you are absolutely positive of identification.

To prepare for an emergency, every hunter and angler should carry in his pocket a piece of candle and matches in a water-tight match safe. In case of becoming lost or injured, one can readily start a camp fire.

Hunters Have "Lost" Signal.

When you find you are lost, fire two shots ten seconds apart. Then wait 60 seconds and fire another. That is to be the official signal of distress. If some hunter who is not lost hears the shots, he is to fire one shot in answer. The lost hunter will then fire one shot in recognition.

But if the first signal is not heard, the lost hunter should wait five minutes before he repeats the cry. Then he is to fire again in the same manner.

Mr. Finley is sending letters telling of this code to every gun club in the state. He believes the sportsmen will adopt it as the standard and come to listen whenever a shot is heard. If a second shot comes ten seconds after the first, they will know someone is in trouble, and the third shot a minute afterward will be proof, conclusive and make the one who knows where he is to rally to the aid of the one who does not.

Deputy Game Warden Chas. B. Orsi has been informed by W. L. Finley, the man who runs the game distribution of the state with a righteous hand, that 18 crates of birds with six pairs in each will arrive in a day or two for liberation here. The silver pheasants go to the Walter Pierce preserve, and also a crate of Golden's go there.

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Whiskey Law Held Void.

Ottumwa, Aug. 8.—Judge Hunter of the state district court ruled the Webb-Kenyon law, which prohibits the shipment of liquor from wet to dry states, unconstitutional, on the grounds that it delegates to the states the authority to regulate interstate commerce which belongs to congress alone.

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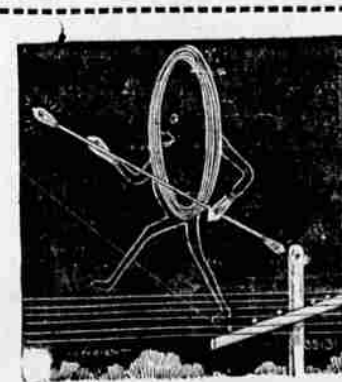
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
