CONTRACTOR HORSTMAN COMMENCES CONTRACT.

New Plate Glass Front of Modern Type to Be Installed.

Complete renovation of the glass front of the A. T. Hill drug store was commenced this morning by Contractor Horstman. TEACHER RESIGNS POST

SCIENCE TEACHER NOT TO RETURN THIS YEAR.

Proposed Agricultural Course Slightly Upset as Result.

A telegram received this morning by School Clerk A. C. Williams, from John R. Montgomery, for the past two years science teacher at La Grande high school, is to the effect that he will not return to his position in La Grande with the opening of the fall term. At the last teachers' election Mr. Montgomery asked the board for a leave of absence of one year in which time he was to complete a course in agriculture and return to open an extensive course in that branch here. This request was granted but before school closed Mr. Montgomery changed his mind and was to return this year to teach. While in California on his vacation he was offered a position he says, he could not turn down and as a consequence La Grande is without a science teacher. As the time before school opens is so short the school board is casting about for a suitable applicant and is rushing matters as much as possible.
