DEDICATORY ADDRESS TO BE MADE BY HIM.

LAST QUARTERLY CONFERENCE ENTHUSES MEMBERS.

The annual reports of the various heads of the several departments were read and filed. The church is in splendid condition. A resolution was presented and unanimously adopted complimenting Dr. E. B. Fyke for the splendid work that had been accomplished the past 12 months under his direction and officially asking that he be returned to this charge for another year. Among the many items of interest contained in the pastor's report was the statement that 93 new members had been received into the church during the past year. The Sunday school also is looking forward to a large increase in numbers and efficiency when the new church is completed, the present quarters being entirely inadequate to the present demands.
