DEAD TRAMP CONVICT.

Victim of Portland Robbery Proves to Be Ex-Prison Personage.

Portland, Aug. 23.—The man giving his name as Joe Barron, who died at the hospital here after having been shot by one of the robbers in the hold-up of the Soo-Spokane Flyer, Sullivan's Gulch last Tuesday night, has been identified by Detective Coleman as J. B. Allison, who was released from the Walla Walla penitentiary recently after having served 15 years for a murder committed in Seattle. Chief of Police Clark stated that he believed Barron to be one of the robbers and that he had been shot by mistake. Four suspects are being held, but it is said that nothing can be found to connect them with the crime of holding-up the train. The police are working secretly.

Arkansas Patterns After Missouri.

Little Rock, Ark., Aug. 23.—With the return of C. W. Fall Highfill, state highway engineer, from Missouri, where he investigated the good roads movement there, state officials today formally urged the inauguration of a good roads day here similar to that recently held in Missouri, where Governor Major donned overalls and worked on the roads.
