HOLDUP REPORT DISPROVED

ALLEGED HOLD-UP YESTERDAY CALLED DRUNKEN FIGHT.

Participants Arrested and Fined—None Seriously Hurt in Mix-Up.

What was at first reported to be a daylight holdup yesterday afternoon, developed on investigation, the police say, into a brawl in which some of the participants were intoxicated. Three of the four included in the batch arrested late yesterday afternoon, were arraigned today and fined for disorderly conduct. Frank Dempsey was the man who claimed to have been robbed but if the police have it right, there was no robbery about it. Pete Girard, Frank Harrington and a stranger had been loafing about the shaded spots near the stockyards when Dempsey is said to have approached them and made indecent actions in view of some passing ladies. The

group upbraided him they say, and a fight started. None were seriously hurt and today Harrington was fined \$2.50, Girard the same, the stranger released and Dempsey fined \$15. A man named Brown, Jack Whiting and a man named Clancey, were also arraigned today on disorderly charges and of the entire group, Brown and Whiting paid fines. The others are headed for the street department.
