NOTICE TO THE DELINQUENT PROPERTY OWNERS

Attention of delinquent property owners in improvement districts is called to the provisions of the city charter regarding the provisions for collecting delinquent improvement assessments. As it is absolutely necessary that these assessments be collected before September first, the council will be required to foreclose liens on delinquent property owners in accordance with the charter provisions which are as follows:

Section 59. Within five days from the expiration of the time limited for paying taxes to the treasury, the city treasurer must return the tax roll to the council, distinguishing thereon the amount of taxes and those remaining unpaid.

Section 60. The council must thereafter order the recorder to deliver the tax roll to the chief of police and issue

and annex thereto a warrant directed to the chief of police, commanding him to proceed forthwith to collect the delinquent taxes upon such roll and in the manner provided by law, and paying the same to the treasurer together with the cost of collection and return the warrant with his doings thereon, and the receipt of the treasurer to the recorder.

Section 61. The warrant for the purpose of collecting such delinquent taxes and assessments shall be deemed an execution and shall have the force and effect thereof against any person, firm or corporation against whom such taxes or assessments are levied and charged on the tax roll, and shall be executed and returned in like manner.

NOTICE OF PROPOSED STREET IMPROVEMENT.

To whom it may concern: You are hereby notified that the commissioners appointed by the common council, of the city of La Grande, Oregon, to make an examination of the property upon which assessments are to be levied to pay the costs and expenses of the street improvement hereinafter described, as to the valuation and extent, if any of the benefits to be derived by said property by reason of said improvement, have made their report in writing to said council, which report has been received by said council, and is on file in the office of the recorder of said city, and is open for your inspection. That it is the intention of said council to levy a special assessment against all the property hereinafter described for the purpose of paying the costs and expenses of improving Spring avenue from the Southwest property line of Washington avenue to the west curb line of Alder street by laying thereon hard surface pavement and constructing concrete curbs and drainage according to the plans and specifications therefor heretofore adopted by said council and on file in the office of the recorder of said city.

That the real property included in and the boundaries of the district benefitted and affected by said proposed improvement are as follows:

Beginning at a point 120 feet west of the west property line of Alder street, said point being due west of the center of Block 11, Romig's addition to the city of La Grande, Oregon; and running thence east through the center of Blocks 11, 8, 5 and 2 to Romig's addition to the city of La Grande, Oregon and through the center of Blocks 13 and 10, Grandy's addition to the City of La Grande, Oregon and continuing on the same line through the unsubdivided property lying between the west property line of Fourth street and the east property line of said Block 10, Grandy's addition to the city of La Grande, Oregon, to the center line of Fourth street; thence south along the center line of Fourth street to a point 120 feet north from the north property line of Spring avenue; thence east through blocks 103, 102 and 101, Chaplain's addition to the city of La Grande, Oregon, to the center line of Washington avenue; thence southerly along the center line of Washington avenue to the center line of Seventh street, hence south along the center line of Seventh street to a point opposite the center of block 69, Chaplain's addition to the city of La Grande, Oregon; thence west through the centers of Blocks 99, 98 and 97 Chaplain's addition to the city of La Grande, Oregon and continuing west on the same line across the unsubdivided property lying between the west property line of Fourth street and the east property line of block 11, Grandy's addition to the city of La Grande, Oregon and continuing west on the same line through blocks 11 and 12 Grandy's addition to the city of La Grande, Oregon and through the centers of blocks 3, 4, 9 and 10 Romig's addition to the city of La Grande, Oregon to a point west 120 feet from the west property line of Alder street; thence north to the place of beginning, all in the city of La

Grande, Oregon, and the estimated cost of said proposed improvement is \$31,000.00. You will further take notice that said city council will meet at the council chamber in the city building of said city on the 10th day of September, 1913, at eight o'clock p. m., of said day to consider making said proposed levy and will then and there grant a hearing to any and all persons feeling aggrieved against, or on account of, said proposed assessment.
