MECHANICAL PERFECTION OF BABIES IS ESTABLISHED

County Fair Better Babies Contest to Be Interesting and Instructive

Last year the county fair board attempted the "Better Babies Contest" on a small scale as an experiment with such success that that this year they are going to go in for the contest on a larger scale and in all details. All over the United States the Better Babies contests are in full swing and are being given more press notice than anything similar which has come to the attention of the American people. The tots of today who will be the bankers, the brokers, the merchants and civic officers of tomorrow who have in other years grown to manhood unaided, because of the natural surroundings which were theirs to make the soundest health and most perfect body, must today be taught to build up that body and to keep that health which the city pavements and tenement districts deny, as a natural gift to the baby. In all classes of people and in all parts of this country a most marked interest has been manifested in the contests, at one place there was no prouder mother than the little Indian woman, whose baby held a high percentage on the final score card.

Judging from the large birth record of this valley for the past year and the large number of entries last fall. La Grande should produce some babies that will rival those who now hold the state score for the highest degrees of physical perfection, and the fair authorities will soon be making preparations for the greatest baby show in the history of La Grande, the baby show where looks and pretty smiles don't count, but where the baby will stand upon the quality of physical tests it passes.

Following are notes taken from the woman's Home Companion, score card which will be used by the judges in the contest from which one can gain some idea of what is required in the perfect baby:

Table of Standards.

The infant of six months must weigh 17 pounds to be normal, be 27 inches tall, measure 17 1/2 inches about the chest, the head and abdomen, be of five-inch lateral diameter of the chest, 4 1/2 inches from front to back, have an arm of 10 inches and a 10-inch leg. At the age of nine months, these figures should be 19, 28, 18, 5 of chest, 4 1/2 chest to back 11 inch arms and legs. At the age of a year, the weight is

20, height 29, circumference of head, chest and abdomen 18 1/2 inches, lat. dia. 5, chest front to back 4 3/4 and the arm is one-half inch shorter than the leg, which is 12 1/2.

At 16 months it is 23, 30, 18 1-2, 5, 12 1/2 and 13 1/2.

At two years the figures should be: Weight 25, height 32, circumference of head 1 1/2, circumference of chest 20, abdomen 19 1/2, lat. diameter of chest 6, chest front 5, length of arm 14 1/2, length of leg 15 1/2.

At 32 months the weight should be 29, height 35, cir. of head 19 1/2, of chest 20 1/2, abdomen same as head, lat. dia. of chest 6 1/4 front to back 5 1/2, arm 14 3/4 inches long, and leg 15 3/4.

At 36 months, the weight is 32, the height 36 1/2, cir. of head 20, cir. of chest 21, of abdomen the same as the head, lat. dia. of chest 6 1-4, chest to back 5 1/2 length of arm 15, length of leg 16 1/4.

NOTICE OF PROPOSED STREET IMPROVEMENTS.

To whom it may concern: You are hereby notified that the commissioners appointed by the common council, of the city of La Grande, Oregon, to make an examination of the property, upon which assessments are to be levied to pay the costs and expenses of the street improvement hereinafter described, as to the valuation and extent, if any of the benefits to be derived by said property by reason of said improvement, have made their report in writing to said council, which report has been received by said council, and is on file in the office of the recorder of said city, and is open for your inspection. That it is the intention of said council to levy a special assessment against all the property hereinafter described for the purpose of paying the costs and expenses of improving Fourth street from the south line of "O" avenue to the north line of "C" avenue, by laying thereon Gravel Bitulithic pavement, according to the plans and specifications therefor heretofore adopted by said council and on file in the office of the recorder of said city.

That the real property included in and the boundaries of the district benefited and affected by said proposed improvements are as follows: Commencing at the northeast corner of block No. 59, Chaplin's addition to the city of La Grande, Oregon; running thence west to a point 10 feet west of the northwest corner of lot 4; block No. 74 of said addition; running thence due south to the north line of "C" avenue; thence running east to the southeast corner of block No. 10, Chaplin's addition to the city of La Grande; thence north to the place of beginning, the same consisting of and including the following described real property: Blocks 10, 11, 20, 21, 30, 31, 40, 41, 50, 51, 58 and 59 of Chaplin's addition to the city of La Grande; the east half of blocks 74, 75, 88, 89 and 96 of Chaplin's addition to the city of La Grande, and blocks 11, 10 and 1 of Arnold & Dray's addition to the town of La Grande (now the city of La Grande) and the east half of blocks 4 and 5 of Arnold's addition to the town of La Grande (now the city of La Grande), and the east half of block 4 D street, of the original town site of La Grande (now the city of La Grande), and the east half of that certain tract of land lying and being between Third and Fourth streets, and "K" avenue, known as the school house property, all in the city of La Grande, Oregon, and the estimated cost of said proposed improvement is \$40,000.00. You will further take notice that said city council will meet at the council chamber in the city building of said city on the 3rd day of September, 1913, at eight o'clock p. m. of said day to consider making said proposed levy and will then and there grant a hearing to any and all persons feeling aggrieved against, or on account of, said proposed assessment.
