WALLOWA HAS PLENTY ALFALFA

SECOND CROP TO BE CUT AT ONCE.

All Kinds of Hay and Grain in Fine Shape.

Enterprise, Ore., Aug. 29—(Special)—The second crop of alfalfa and clover will soon be ready to cut. It promises to be a large crop in most places, the freeze not damaging it as much as was expected. The other crops of the valley, barley, wheat, oats and hay, are fine. This season has been better than common for the farmers. In lots of the fields on Alder Slope the grain has grown as high as the fences. on the Beecher, Kooch, Haas, Chas. Crow and other places the hay and grain was too heavy as much of it fell to the ground and will be hard to harvest. On the ground that was used for sugar beets for two years there are large crops this year.
