WALTER E. PIERCE DIVORCED.

Boise Promoter is Defendant in Suit Brought by His Wife.

Boise, Sept. 10.—Mrs. W. E. Pierce was granted a decree of divorce Monday evening from Walter E. Pierce, a well known local real estate man, railroad builder and capitalist.

A complaint in which a divorce was prayed for was filed by Mrs. Pierce some time ago. It was understood at the time that the complaint contained sensational allegations. That document was immediately withdrawn by the attorneys for Mrs. Pierce and was never made public.

After the plaintiff had introduced her evidence the defense rested. Mrs. Pierce had filed an answer which was a general denial of the charges preferred against him by his wife, but other than that he made no defense.

Mrs. Pierce was given an equitable share of the estate; which is a large one. The stipulation contained no inventory, however, and its exact value cannot be determined. Most of the estate consisted of community property.

It had not been generally known that the case was to be tried, and there were few spectators on hand when it was called. No secrecy was maintained in the proceedings.
