BETWEEN ELGIN AND LA GRANDE

One September 13th a special train will leave Elgin at 6:45 a. m. arriving at La Grande about 7:35 a. m., where it will connect with the regular special and leave La Grande 7:45 a. m. The return trip will be made on September 13th; leaving Pendleton 7:00 p. m. arriving La Grande about 9:50 p. m. leaving La Grande about 10:00 p. m. and arriving at Elgin about 10:45 p. m.

Stops will be made at all points to take on and discharge passengers.

BETWEEN UMATILLA AND PENDLETON

A steam train with baggage car and coaches will be substituted for Motor service between these two points and operated on schedule of Motors Nos. 15 and 16 on September 10th.
